Best Solution: Tesla

If you're home is not in deep shade & it's in your budget (we decided it was more important than a new car or new un-cat-scratched sofas), then go for the Tesla Powerwall(s). Even though the Yeti 1000 or 3000 (with or without solar panels) have a lot of appeal (no permits and available within days), having your home circuits seamlessly backed up during a Blackout is a joy.

Second Choice: Yeti 1000

If you decide on a Yeti instead, the medium size Yeti 1000 is a good place to start, since you could add the solar panels later if wanted. If your house is shady (sun-challenged) the larger Yeti 3000 is pretty useful even without solar panels. The name indicates that it will last about 3 times as long as the Yeti 1000, or about 3 days of communications backup.
